YOU'RE ON THE AIR! Todd Baker, Class of 1989



Todd Baker, Class of 1989, grew up in *Maywood Hills*. His parents, Larry and Sherrill, were both teachers in the *Northshore School District*. His mother, formerly Sherrill Grady, a Bothellite since 1939, graduated from *Bothell High School* in 1952.

Todd's education consisted of a mix of public, private, and home schooling. He attended kindergarten and first grade at *Maywood Hills Elementary* and then transferred to *King's Garden* and *Heritage Christian* schools for second through seventh grades. Next, he was home schooled for one year and then returned to finish at *Canyon Park Junior High* and *Bothell High School*. He also did a brief stint at *Shoreline Community College*. Todd especially recalls the weekend keg parties in Woodinville in an area called "The Pits" as fun times during his high school years.

Baseball was a big part of Todd's life. He began playing *Little League* baseball at age eight and continued to play in other community programs up through *Junior American Legion* and later, adult leagues. He pitched the final game to win the 13 year old Dis-

trict 8 championship in 1984. Todd played in junior high, high school, and junior college, as well.

To earn extra money, he worked at a variety of jobs, beginning with being a paper boy and delivering the *Bothell Citizen*. Then, he painted houses with his dad during summers, and later worked at the *Bothell Furniture Store*, both in the warehouse and as a delivery man.

The following are questions and his answers from an interview regarding Todd's career as an On-Air Personality:

Q: When did you first become interested in being a "DJ" and later, a radio personality?

A: I was first interested as a young boy playing "DJ" in front of the home stereo with records and tapes, using a microphone given to me by my grandfather, Clarence Grady.

Q: What training did you receive to prepare you for becoming a radio personality?

A: I got my first on-air experience at *Bellevue High School* where I attended a vocational program in the afternoons of my junior year. All the area high schools at the time shared their vo-tech programs. Bellevue had a student-run radio station and TV program, and for me it was a no-brainer, as I often interrupted class to talk and be the center of attention, anyway. After high school, I attended the *Connecticut School of Broadcasting* (Bellevue, WA campus) to hone my skills.

Q: What and where was your first job?

A: Shortly after finishing broadcasting school, I found myself on-air in the middle of the night at a top 40 radio station in Gillette, Wyoming.

Q: What other places have you worked?

A: After a year in Wyoming, I returned to the Seattle area. The stations I worked at were KUBE, KPLZ, KQBZ and KJR-FM. From there I traveled to Los Angeles, where I worked at Westwood One, KBIG, KKGO FM, All Comedy Radio, and National Lampoon Radio over a period of ten years. With the rise in popularity of country music, I now find myself on the east coast working at a country station (96.9, The Kat) doing the PM drive time, in Charlotte, North Carolina.

Q: What do you like most about your job?

A: I am hired to talk and entertain people and they pay me for this!

Q: What are some of the interesting things about your job?

- A. I get to travel around the country and broadcast from special events such as the CMA Music Fest in Nashville.
- Q: What are the side jobs and perks that come as a result of being a radio personality?
- A: Some of the side gigs would be commercial endorsements, public appearances such as introducing entertainers at concerts, and other things of that nature. Some of the great perks are concert tickets, CD's and the privilege of meeting a lot of celebrities.
- Q: Have you ever been at a loss for words and how much of what you say is scripted?
- A: Can't say that I have. What I say on the air is off the cuff and ad-libbed 99.9% of the time. I can't speak for all radio personalities, but for me, that's the only way I do a show.
- Q: What is the most unusual or moving response you've received from a listener?
- A: I once received an email from a listener who wanted to let me know how much she and her husband enjoyed the show in the afternoon. At the time I was doing the PM drive on KKGO FM in Los Angeles. She conveyed to me that it was a little bit of levity and enjoyment every day on their way to her husband's chemotherapy treatment for brain cancer. A few months later I received a call from her informing me that she had lost her husband, but wanted me to know that I had been able to provide them with a little bit of joy. The opportunity to do that is truly God given and I thank *Him* for my being able to put a smile on the faces of people I usually never meet, especially those in circumstances such as theirs.
- Q: Who is the most impressive entertainer you've met and what impressed you about them?
- A: I would have to say Taylor Swift; especially given the way she handled the recent situation at the MTV Video Music Awards. She's a class act and is as nice and real as she is talented.
- Q: Why did someone in Los Angeles want you to change your name?
- A: Unknown to me at the time, there was a character actor also by the name of Todd Baker. He was a regular on the "The Gary Shandling Show," an HBO series. After I became somewhat successful, he felt I was infringing on his territory and causing him to lose work. He wanted me to add my middle initial to my name on the air to differentiate between us. That would have made me Todd E. Baker. Looks fine in print, but when spoken that becomes "Toddy Baker!" Long story short, he threatened legal action, called me on air several times, and finally went away when he realized he had no case as Todd Baker is my REAL name.
- Q: Did you ever have an embarrassing incident happen on the air?
- A: While on air at KUBE 93 in Seattle in the afternoon, we were doing a feature called "The Five O'Clock Traffic Jam" with a live in studio club DJ mixing on turn tables. We were getting ready to talk and the DJ (who's name I leave out) started to spin the record backward (as he always did) creating an effect on the air and accidentally sent the needle flying off the record. He didn't realize the mics were hot and yelled out "Oh Poop," only the word actually started with an S. As it was my show and my responcibility, I'm glad the FCC wasn't paying attention that day.
- Q: In what ways has being a radio personality changed your life?
- A: It's how I met my wife! I was hosting a show heard nationally at the time, and on the weekends I flew around the country to appearances in various markets where the show aired. I was changing planes in Philly, waiting for my delayed connection, when I noticed this beautiful girl talking on the phone. She eventually came and sat near me, and asked me if I had heard the announcement that had just been made about our flight. To this day I think she just wanted to talk to me, but she insists she really missed what they said! We ended up sitting next to each other on the flight (Ok, I changed my seat and plunked myself down next to her) and a year and a half later we were married.
- Q: How long have you been in radio and what formats and other jobs have you done as part of your career?
- A: I have done many formats during my eighteen years in radio, including top 40's and 80's, classic hits, adult contemporary, talk, and most recently, country. I've also done nationally syndicated shows, some of which have been heard around the world.

In addition, I served as president of Programming/Network General Manager at *National Lampoon Radio* and before that was the Operations Manager for *All Comedy Radio*.

Q: How has the business changed since you became a part of it?

A: When I started, it was a growing business, and I played these new things called CD's. Now it's a shrinking industry and the computer plays the music.


Q: What do you enjoy doing in your spare time?

BHS BLUE TRAIN

"Blue Train" refers to the *Bothell High School* Football Team. With 80 Varsity players and 39 sophomore players this year, they expect a good season.

On September 12, 2009 *O'Dea* and *Bothell* met for the first time since 1967. Both teams have great potential for becoming league leaders.

Bothell's head coach is Tom Bainter, who is beginning his tenth season as head coach. He has over 83 wins and just 21 losses. In 2002, 2003, 2006, and 2007, he led his team to Kingco championships.

What's New In Your Hometown?

NEW FIRE CHIEF

Bob Van Horne assumed his new position as the City of Bothell's Fire Chief on September 21, 2009. Previously, Van Horne had served as Deputy Fire Chief for Renton, having worked his way up from beginning as a firefighter in 1981. He was selected from 37 original applicants, narrowed through in-depth interviews. The Fire Chief supervises nine civilian and 54 uniformed employees and is responsible for all fire and EMS services for the community.

GREEN BUILDING INCENTIVES

Bothell is one of the first cities in Washington state to provide incentives for *Green* construction. The Bothell City Council adopted new regulations this summer to provide incentives for green building. The Bothell Vision Statement was revised to add the commitment "to live and work in ways that meet the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs."

Incentives include reduced fees and parking requirements for certified green buildings. Under the newly created "Green Planned Unit Development," lot sizes and street widths may be reduced in exchange for constructing energy efficient buildings. Green features include natural lighting, improved indoor air quality, and use of pervious pavement, among others. The goal is healthier living conditions and decreasing human impact on ecosystems.

BOTHELL GETS A+ ON STATE AUDIT

Citizens of Bothell can rest assured that the city is accountable for their tax dollars. The Washington State Auditor's office conducts annual audits on cities to verify compliance

with state laws, as well as each city's adopted policies. This year's focus included scrutinizing financial reporting, federal compliance, safeguarding assets, and restricted revenues.

The City of Bothell was notified by the state that they had zero audit findings, making 2009 the eighth year in a row with this stellar performance.

CITY GOVERNMENT

The *Bothell City Council*, comprised of seven members with equal decision making powers, establishes policy and governs the city. The members are elected by citizens and serve a four-year term. Positions are part-time and non-partisan. The council meets three times each month, except August.

The City Council elects a Mayor and Deputy Mayor to serve a two-year term. The Mayor presides over meetings and participates and votes as other members, but has no veto powers. He also acts as ceremonial representative at public functions and has the authority to declare an emergency. In his absence, the Deputy Mayor assumes responsibilities, and the Mayor appoints a council member to act in the absence of both.

MEMBERSHIP

The Association has experienced financial difficulty during this economy, as people cut back to basics. Membership has dropped, reducing revenue, while costs continue to climb. Bylaws dictate that 50 % of revenue goes to operation, with the balance to scholarship, which resulted in a shortage in the operating budget recently. The board made a few changes in an effort to not raise dues and potentially lose more members. First, the bylaws have been amended to apply 70% to operations and 30% to scholarships. In addition, a smaller storage unit now stores archives and business materials and we dropped the size of our post office box. (Please note our new address is P. O. Box 554 instead of 298) We also now offer online newsletters for a discount, which saves on postage. (Please consider this option.) It may also be necessary to discontinue mailing membership cards to save on postage. If any alumni wish to help with these shortcomings, donations are greatly appreciated and may be made in honor of or in memory of individuals or classes.
