BHSAA V. P. RECEIVES McMASTER HERITAGE AWARD

Our own L.G. “Bud” Eaton, Class of 1961, received the *McMaster Heritage Award* on February 2, 2011 from the *Kenmore Heritage Society* at the Eleventh Annual Founder’s Day Celebration.

This award was named after John McMaster who named *Kenmore* in 1901 after his home town of Kenmore, Ontario. John moved here in 1889 with his brother. After opening the *McMaster Shingle Mill*, he felt the area needed a name. He and his wife Annie, two sons, and four daughters resided in the area. John was very active in the community. It is no wonder the criteria for the award in his name is given to a person that has made outstanding contributions to the Kenmore community over a long period of time and has an appreciation and understanding of Kenmore’s history and heritage.

Les (Bud) has been an involved Kenmore resident for over 50 years. He became a volunteer firefighter in 1963 and a fulltime firefighter in 1966 until he retired as Fire Chief in 1989.

Bud was born in 1941 in New York to Corinne and George Eaton. He has three sisters, Nancy, Carol, and Sandee Magnaw, Class of 1963, and two brothers, who both died at an early age. The family originally moved to Kenmore in 1946 but moved back to New York in 1951. There were additional moves before the family finally returned to Kenmore in 1959.

Bud graduated in 1961 from *Bothell High School*. During high school, he worked at *John Bluhm’s Mobile Service Station* in Bothell, *Lake City Shell Service Station*, and his favorite, *Mel’s Zesto*, in Kenmore. After graduation, he worked as an apprentice mechanic for a short time, but a desire to find a different career led him to firefighting. In 1963 he married Annette Ross, Class of 1956, and they have resided in the same home for the last 47 years. Their daughter, Shelby, and son, Ross, attended Northshore schools for their entire educational years. Ross and his wife, April Byers Ross, have given them four grandchildren.

Retirement as the 5th Fire Chief of *Kenmore Fire Department* in 1989 opened new opportunities to work in the *King County Fire Marshall’s* office, at the *Redmond Fire Department*, *King County Arson Unit*, and to volunteer in the community. He completely retired from fire service in 2003. Since then, Les has been active in the *Northshore Rotary*, *BHS Alumni Association* (Vice President), *Kenmore Heritage Society* (Charter member and President), *Jr. JC’s*, and *NRA*. Bud enjoys family, hunting, fishing, and showing and restoring classic cars. The *Association* is proud of you, Bud, and thanks you for all your invaluable help on the board and now as an officer.

WHAT WILL THE FATE OF THE *OLD WOODINVILLE SCHOOL* BE?

The *City of Woodinville* has completed a study on what to do with the *Old Woodinville School*. The *Old School*, built in the 1930's as a WPA Project, is one of only four landmark properties in Woodinville. We don't have many old buildings and need to save our history. According to the study, the building is in pretty good shape but needs to be brought up to code, retrofitted for earthquakes, and needs new mechanical systems.

This building is important to our community. It is a gateway to the city in that it is one of the first buildings you see when you come into town and sits on Main Street at the entrance to the Civic Center Campus. A school has sat on this site since 1892. The school has two floors with a basement. It is relatively small at only about 5,000 square feet per floor.

The city is asking for comments and suggestions on what to do with the *Old School*. The *Woodinville Heritage Society* has been involved in trying to save the school for the past 15 years, and envisions a mix of community and private uses. The town needs a small community theater and library branch downtown. Woodinville also has over 500,000 tourists each year drawn by over 70 wineries and there is no place to go to find out where they are located and what other activities are of interest. The *Old School* could serve as a connector between the wineries to the south of town by Ste. Michelle, the downtown, and wineries to the north in the warehouse district.

The alternative development the *Heritage Society* prefers is "Option C" and costs between \$5 - \$6 million. The *Heritage Society* proposes to finance the project with voter approved bonds. This would cost the average Woodinville homeowner less than \$90. a year. Since the *Old School* is relatively small, it is not feasible to recoup the rehabilitation costs through market rents so having a private developer do the project is unlikely. Additionally, the *Heritage Society* feels that this has been a community building since 1892 and should continue to serve the community.

If you agree with this vision, please send an e-mail to Zach Schmitz at the *City of Woodinville* saying that the *Old School* needs to be saved for a mix of community and private uses, as follows:

- Community Theater/meeting room
- Library Branch
- Restored Classroom where elementary students can go to have a turn of the century school experience
- Visitors/Information Center
- Wine Tasting
- Retail Shops
- Restaurant with a deck overlooking the ball fields
- Brew Pub
- Offices

Key issues to mention are that The *Old School* is an important gateway to the city and can be a link between the tourist area, downtown, and the warehouse district. It can be the "Visitors Center" Woodinville so desperately needs. Option C is the best and should be financed through voter approved bonds. Bothell to Welcome 27,000 New Citizens

For over a year now, the *Bothell City Council* has researched the possible annexation of surrounding unincorporated areas in both King and Snohomish counties. The original impetus to begin the process was in response to a 2009 petition for annexation election with 1000 signatures. This led to prioritization of a two year plan beginning in 2010.

The annexation areas would add approximately 27,000 residents to the city, catapulting it from the 32nd to the 15th largest city in the state, in terms of population. Bothell was recognized as an obvious choice to provide urban services to these areas. The largest is 5.6 square miles in unincorporated Snohomish County, which would account for 22,000 of the new residents. An annexation election will be held in this area and the other areas, only one in King County, would be annexed by methods other than election.

During the course of the *City of Bothell's* development, annexation has represented the major increases in population. Residents in potential annexation areas should visit www.imaginebothell.com for more information and a map that shows Bothell's city limits in 2010 and proposed annexation areas in King and Snohomish counties.


